1 APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

Apologies were received from Liz Wells & Margaret Codling.

2 DECLARATION OF INTEREST

CL, VC, KP & CW declared an interest in agenda item 6.

3 MINUTES

Minutes of the meeting held on 12th May 2021 were proposed, seconded and agreed as an accurate record of the meeting and signed by the Chair.

4 CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

The Chair reported that she now had a new dedicated CCC laptop and email address.

5 SECRETARY'S REPORT

The Secretary had nothing to report.

6 LINCOLNSHIRE COMMUNITY FOUNDATION

The Salvation Army underspend is to be returned, the equipment is to be passed on for CLIP to use on the understanding that if the SA start up again, the equipment can be returned to them or shared with them. The MOU between CCC and LN12 CIC is still a work in progress. Various grants forms have been sent out including one to St Peter's Annexe. A request has been made that the laptops which were originally funded for Mablethorpe Air Cadets, could be loaned to the Mablethorpe children who now go to Louth air cadets and maybe the new Youth Forum. The Evangelical Church wish to continue with a gas boiler rather than an air source heat pump system. It was proposed, seconded and agreed to release the grant even though it was retrospective. It was only retrospective because the Partnership had asked them to explore alternative options, which took more time. A £200 Covid Recovery grant was awarded to Sutton on Sea & Trusthorpe Carnival Committee. Furnichurch have re-opened but turnover is really low and they may be running at a loss. It was agreed to release their second tranche of funding £10,200 once the partnership had received and considered an overview of their current financial position. This could happen prior to the next meeting. CAB will start delivering their service 1st August at both Mablethorpe Community Hall and Meridale Hall Sutton on Sea.

7 TREASURER'S REPORT

Payments have been made to EE, Talk Talk, Facebook Ads and the Phone Coop and Trotters Traders. It was agreed to cancel the Phone Coop contract.

8 COMMUNICATIONS GROUP REPORT

CW reported that he now has all the information needed for the next Chatback. Included in this issue will be an invitation for the public to attend an open meeting, where there will be an open opportunity for people to shape our final Big Local CCC Plan. KP to send out invitations to previously funded groups.

9 PROJECT GROUPS REPORT

HERITAGE TRAIL

VC reported that the cost of the steel etc. for The Hera shipwreck have rocketed these past few months. A groundwork survey was due to be done this Friday but has now been delayed due to ELDC requiring an updated FRA from the EA. CW asked why the cycle racks (part of the Street furniture) may be the last part of the project to be funded, and also if they could be nearer every access point to Mablethorpe, Trusthorpe & Sutton on Sea.

KP & PS have met with The Beach Bar Boxing Club and are helping them with business advice and updating policies and procedures.

QUEBEC ROAD

New compost and plants have been added to the bulb circle.

FUTURE EVENTS

KP has not yet spoken to the Town Council regarding the Christmas event until there is more certainty over Covid regulations and Covid numbers but will contact Sutton on Sea Residents Association to discuss if they have any plans for a Christmas event.
